



## HVCoiiN 1.0 Participants

### The Home Visiting Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network

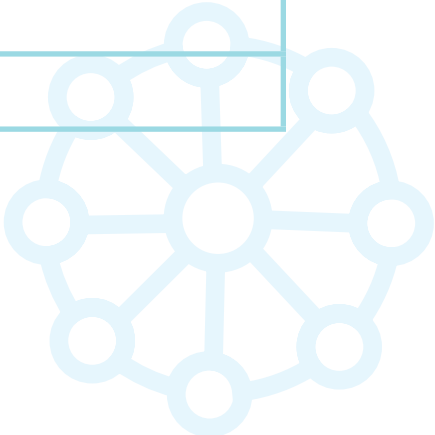
(HV CoiIN 1.0) brought together teams from local home visiting service agencies across 13 awardees to support collaborative learning, rapid testing for improvement, and sharing of best practices, using the Breakthrough Series model to conduct small tests of change (known as Plan-Do-Study-Act cycles) to adapt evidence-based practices to local contexts.

Teams integrated Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) methodologies into their existing evidence-based home visiting programs to

- (1) disseminate evidence-based practices that are known to work,
- (2) innovate,
- (3) achieve results faster,
- (4) build leaders of quality improvement in home visiting, and
- (5) demonstrate the effectiveness of home visiting in large-scale implementation.

**HV CoIIN 1.0** tracked individual agency's progress, using standardized outcomes and process measures for each target area. Each agency reported on these measures monthly as they tested and adapted the recommended changes. A list of awardees and participating local implementing agencies follows.
