

WHAT IS HV COLLIN?

The **home visiting collaborative improvement and innovation network** (HV CollN) brings together Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting awardees and local agencies to develop, test, and implement changes in topics ripe for improvement. These well-tested interventions are then scaled to home visiting agencies across the country to improve maternal and child health outcomes for families in home visiting.

HV CollN Builds Awardee Capacity

Awardees consistently demonstrate increased knowledge in all CQI areas, with the most notable increases in the fundamentals of improvement work, including PDSAs, run charts, and key driver diagrams.

HV COLLN AWARDEES REPORTED



a twofold increase in their knowledge of PDSA cycles



a threefold increase in their knowledge of Run Charts



a fivefold increase in their knowledge of KDDs

KEY INGREDIENTS FOR SUCCESS

- **Build Confidence with a Strong Learning System:** Using a Structured, yet nimble approach with tested and ready-to-use resources tailored support from CQI and topic experts
- **Partner with Parents:** Doing work *with* families not for families
- **Focus on the Future:** Creating sustainable CQI systems that can be replicated and shared
- **Create a Community of Learners:** Developing ample opportunities for peer-to-peer collaboration and sharing

Key Outcomes of HV CoIIN 2.0

Caregiver Depression:

85% of caregivers who screen positive for depression and access evidence-based services (baseline 35%)

Intimate Partner Violence (IPV):

100% of caregivers with identified IPV offered supports or services receive follow-up from home visitor

Breastfeeding:

42% of families report an intention to breastfeed at 36 weeks gestation (baseline 24%)

Health Equity:

100% All participating teams (3 awardees, 10 LIAs) reported improvements across the five MIECHV Health Equity Framework system drivers

Developmental Promotion, Early Detection, and Linkage to Services:

98% of families get developmental surveillance at each home visit (baseline 93%)

Well Child Visits (WCV):

71% of children received last expected WCV (baseline 41%)

Staff Recruitment and Retention:

62% Staff reporting, they “Always” felt supported to handle and manage their work and still be present for families (baseline 40%)

Parent Leadership Across Topics



Our parent leadership journey has been phenomenal. None of our teams started with any parent leadership. Now, all six teams have at least one active and involved parent leader.
